COUNCIL MEETING

August 4, 2014

Attendees: Sean Weckerly, Council President; Sue Anderson, Vice President; Arlene Harms, Gianpiero Lo Piccolo, Kali Sodano, Beverly Wolfe, and Debbie Gentile, Borough Council; Mayor Bob Winkler and Don Williams, Solicitor.

The meeting was called to order at 7:30 p.m. by Council President Sean Weckerly with the Pledge of Allegiance.

Bucks County Redevelopment Authority

Bob White, Bucks County Redevelopment Authority, explained the Cooperation Agreement the Borough would have with the Redevelopment Authority for them to try to find funding for the necessary repairs to the sewer system. They have a Project Development Fund to help find funding for Communities in Bucks County. The Authority is currently assisting the borough with the Bucks County Beautification Grant for the Park Avenue Reconstruction Project and LeGrande Avenue Drainage Project.

MOTION BY ARLENE HARMS TO APPROVE THE MINUTES OF THE JULY 7, 2014 COUNCIL MEETING. SECONDED BY GIANPIERO LO PICCOLO. The vote was 6 ayes, 1 abstention (Sue Anderson). The ayes, carried.

MOTION BY SUE ANDERSON TO APPROVE THE JULY 21, 2014 WORK SESSION MINUTES. SECONDED BY BEVERLY WOLFE. All ayes, carried.

<u>Mayor's Report</u> – Mayor Winkler read his report, which is on file in the secretary's office. The Mayor also explained the reasons why he applied for the ARLE Grant that was submitted last month due to the questions some Council members asked at last month's meeting.

Chief's Report – Chief Sciscio read his report, which is on file in the secretary's office.

<u>Code Enforcement Report</u> - Debbie Gentile read the report, which is on file in the secretary's office.

Committee Reports

Building and Maintenance (Arlene Harms):

Installation of a new toilet, repairs to the ladies' bathroom and the faucet in the janitor's closet have been completed by Finn Plumbing

Two rain barrels will be installed at borough hall. The committee is currently working on prices for a new fence for both sides of the shed.

Ordinance (Arlene Harms):

After review of the pet ordinance, one paragraph needs to be revised. The parking ordinance will be reviewed on certain streets in the borough.

Refuse (Gianpiero Lo Piccolo):

There are forty one recycling containers left for any residents that have not picked one up here at borough hall. Kali Sodano and Gianpiero Lo Piccolo will work with Karen Kondrk on applying for more refuse grant funds.

Finance (Gianpiero Lo Piccolo):

Kali and Gian will be attending a Municipal Basic Budgeting class tomorrow. He mentioned the Mayor's application for the ARLE Grant and would like to work together as a team and work on these projects together.

Community Development (Kali Sodano):

Kali Sodano spoke to Maggie Cunningham from the Clean Water State Revolving Fund. We are eligible for low interest funding for sewer projects as long as we retain the system. Kali is trying to contact Jim McTish of PennVest.

Community Relations (Kali Sodano):

Kali Sodano has researched a communications platform for public and private messaging for municipalities and police departments. This site is secure and will notify residents of important information such as traffic and weather issues by text and email. This would cost between \$2,000.00 and \$5,000.00 annually depending on resident census but is free to law enforcement agencies. She will turn the information over to the Mayor or the Chief.

Borough Facebook page has received 135 likes so far and has reached over 7,000 people. Total impressions are 22,000 and it is going well.

Recreation Field (Sean Weckerly & Beverly Wolfe):

Sean attended a meeting with Mr. DeWitt, 576 Hulmeville Avenue, along with Carol Schuehler, Don Williams and a representative from the Wildcats to discuss drainage and clay issues. A solution has been worked out that should work for all parties involved. He put together a sketch

of the plan for Beverly Wolfe (Recreation Liaison) to distribute to landscapers so we can move forward with the project.

After meeting with the engineer and a representative from the Wildcats, a plan to correct the runoff of clay was put together. We are going to request quotes from landscapers to remove some macadam near the pavilion area. The Diamond Dust that is currently around the infield will be removed then be prepared for sod.

Sewer (Sean Weckerly and Debbie Gentile):

Debbie Gentile asked Sean Weckerly to update residents about the meeting with Bucks County Water and Sewer Authority where her questions were addressed. They seemed to be willing to work with us and offered to help us out with services if necessary. As far as keeping our employees if they acquire our system by purchase or just giving it to them, it would depend on the number of employees and whether the system meets their business model according to Council President.

Repairs continue with the sewer system. We are currently focusing on Quadrant 1, where manhole inserts are being installed. Thirty six were received and another thirty six more are on their way. We have received a quote from the borough engineer on having all of the manholes checked to see what repairs are needed. Our next rain event will help us determine if the inflow has been reduced. Our current monthly invoice was reduced by 3 million gallons. Sump pump inspections have started.

Debbie Gentile distributed her letter of resignation to Council effective August 29, 2014.

Public Safety (Sue Anderson):

Negotiations will start this month on the new police contract which will start in 2015.

EAC (Debbie Gentile):

A "Riparian Zone" sign will be going up on the Rumpf Avenue Open Space properties. Debbie Gentile thanked Bruce Stoneback for his persistence in completing the process and getting it done. Middletown Township will plant some trees and shrubs in this area. This will help out with sediment going into the creek and will help us with our MS4 Report.

Streets (Beverly Wolfe):

The Mayor went to training on Low Volume Gravel Roads to see if we qualify for grant funding. Their priorities are on gravel roads near waterways are what their 2014 funds will be used for. We will submit an application for next year on roads after we can determine with traffic counters what our volumes are. Beverly said that the Mayor sent in the grant application for the signs because we are under a deadline to have the new signs required by law that are very costly.
